Adams County 4-H Shared Project Horse Rules for Participation

Two youth may share one horse based on the established guidelines listed below:

1. Both 4-H members must be in the same 4-H Club and enrolled in a horse project.
2. Application to share a horse must be submitted and approved at the Extension Office.
3. A limit of eight total classes a shared horse can be shown at an individual show (riding or driving). Excluded: Showmanship & Trail In Hand
4. Classes eligible for showing: Showmanship, Pleasure + Equitation if in different age division or discipline, Contesting classes, Reining, Western Riding, Jumping (excluding: Hunter Hack-unless in different age division), Trail, Trail In Hand, Driving & Dressage. Show committee will assist members with being compliant according to 4-H Show Rules.
5. Both members can show horse in proper age class or different division that is judged on individual effort.
6. Only one member can try to qualify for State Fair.
7. Shared horse is not intended to give a member a second horse to show, this is intended to allow a youth without a horse to participate in a "Live Horse" project.
8. Show committee will have authority to scratch a shared horse from a class if horse is deemed to be fatigued or in distress.
