Ohio Tobacco Museum

You may recall the Ohio Tobacco Museum Raffle held last year in order to keep the museum open. With the Ohio Tobacco Festival no longer taking place in Ripley, funds were getting low for paying the water, electric and heat bills. The raffle last year was able to take care of those issues and make a start on some other things to turn the situation around.

The raffle was a huge success and the committee decided to do the raffle again this year to continue to make some necessary changes and improvements to keep the history of tobacco alive and allow others to see what an important part of economy it once was in Southern Ohio.

The raffle this year will be on Saturday, April 14 at the Ripley Elementary School on US 52 near the old tobacco warehouses and the museum. The format is the same as last year. The raffle is a dinner and reverse raffle with 300 tickets sold for \$100 each. There will only be 300 tickets sold, placed in a hopper, and drawn out one at a time. The first ticket drawn out will win \$100. The tenth ticket and every tenth ticket after that will also win \$100 until there are only 5 tickets remaining. The last 5 tickets will win, in order, \$250, \$500, \$750, \$1000 and the last ticket is the Grand Prize of \$8000.

In addition to being in the drawing for the cash prizes, every ticket will include dinner. The dinner will be catered by the Scioto Ribber starting at 6:30 p.m. followed by the drawing at 7:30 p.m. The dinner will include your choice of a Ribeye Steak, Ribs or Chicken. An additional meal is available with each ticket for an additional \$25.
